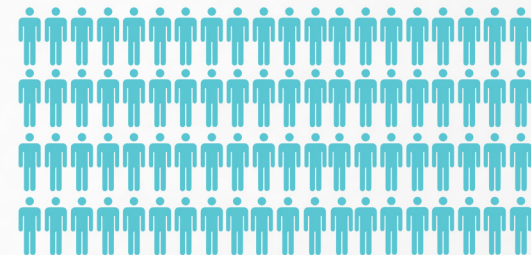

POSITIVE IMPACT IN LIVES AROUND THE WORLD

HAITI

We provide food, educational supplies, clothing, and pay the utilities for an orphanage of 40-60 girls just outside of Port Au Prince, Haiti. The girls range from 2-18 years old. Through ongoing financial support and several trips every year, we have developed a healthy relationship with the girls and are working to see them succeed in every area of life.

After the devastation of Hurricane Isaac, 70 orphans were left without adequate shelter. NPPI responded within 8 days by sending a team of 12 down to construct 7 brand new Safe-T homes. The homes are hurricane and earthquake proof, providing safe shelter for all 70 orphans, as well as providing space for many more who need shelter.

NICARAGUA

By providing food, shelter, transportation, and education to over 30 orphans in Nicaragua, we are making a lasting impact in Central America. These orphans go on to take part in higher education and to become positive contributors to society and to the world as a whole. Not only are we providing for the orphans, but we are also serving the communities by hosting a feeding and tutoring program for the poorest of the poor in the area.

PRISON OUTREACH

In January of 2014 we began a prison outreach to the Women's Homestead Correctional Facility in Miami, FL. Volunteers serve weekly with the inmates providing counseling, study opportunities, and rehabilitation courses. The goal is to grow and equip the inmates with the life skills necessary to be successful, contributing members of society.

ORPHANAGE IN NICARAGUA

This year we adopted an orphanage in Nicaragua. Here we give support in the form of food, shelter, and education following the model we established in Haiti.

DISASTER RESPONSE TEAM

We have the staff and volunteers in place, and we are open to doing more for the communities we serve.

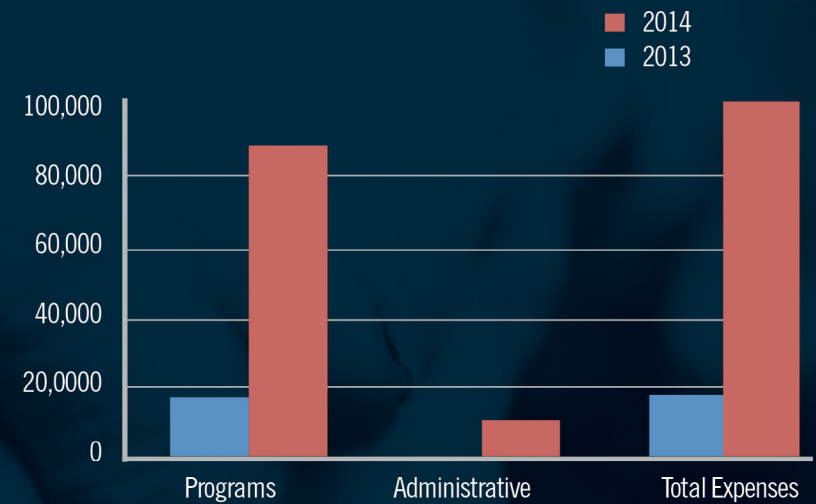
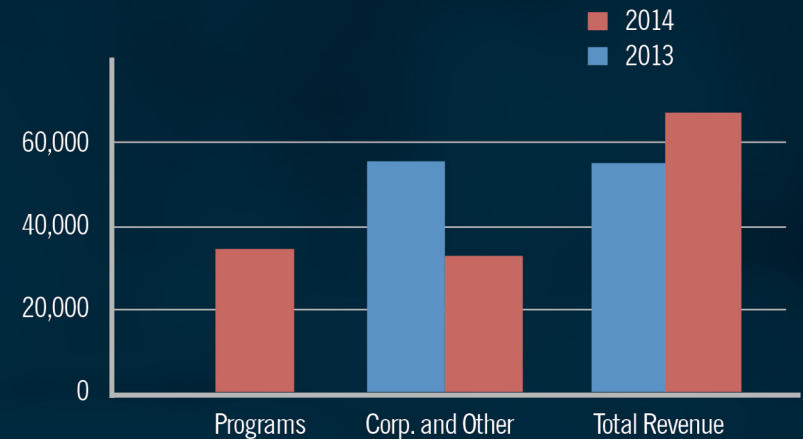
